#### The course will help students to:

- Identify the historical and theological underpinnings of anti-Semitism that influenced Nazi ideology and led to the Holocaust
- Understand the growth of anti-Judaism from early Christianity to its development as the seed bed of a virulent anti-Semitism in the 19<sup>th</sup> Century and its manifestation in Nazi ideology and practice.
- Examine Jewish life in Europe before the Holocaust, the Nazi rise to power and the beginning phases of the war against the Jews.
- Explore the development of the Final Solution and its implementation.
- Consider perspectives of resistance and rescue.
- Discuss the challenges of post-Holocaust theology and examine a variety of Holocaust education strategies.
